



Wandering in Washakie County

DAY TRIPS *South of Worland, WY*

- 1. Gebo Ghost Town.** Located about 20 miles south of Worland on US Highway 20. Gebo was once the largest town in Hot Springs County due to mining during the early 1900's. Today, about all that is left of the original town are graveyards, filled with many infants and children. Reports of hearing crying babies make this a literal ghost town. The town is located on private land, so, be respectful of the restrictions posted at the site.
- 2. Hot Springs State Park.** Located just off of US Highway 20 on the north side of Thermopolis. This state park is very accommodating to visitors and has many activities within in to do. If you are going in an RV, make sure you find out about the alternative route into the park so that the railroad trestle doesn't take the air conditioner off the top.
- 3. Wyoming Dinosaur Center.** Located at 110 Carter Ranch Road in East Thermopolis. This is a non-profit educational organization that includes a museum, dig site tours and digging experiences. Call ahead to join a dig: 800-445-DINO.

- 4. Wind River Canyon Scenic Byway.** Located 4 miles south of Thermopolis on US Highway 20. This beautiful scenic drive is about 20 miles long from its north end to Boysen Reservoir. It is a great area for capturing spectacular photos and watching wildlife. Fishing in the Wind River produces trout, walleye, perch, and many more species. Signage along the highway informs about the different rock ages. There are several pull-outs to get out of traffic and take pictures.
