DAY TRIPS *Ten Sleep Adventure*

1. Ten Sleep Pioneer Museum
2. WigWam Rearing Station
3. Ten Steep Fish Hatchery
4. Leigh creek Monument
5. Ten Sleep Canyon
6. Rome Hill Road
7. Ten Sleep Preserve (call ahead)
8. Spring Creek Raid



Ten Sleep Canyon

Your day trip begins by heading east toward Ten Sleep. The first stop is Ten Sleep Pioneer Museum, located at 436 2nd Street. Following your museum visit, it's time to head east, about four miles, to the Wigwam Rearing Station. Look for the turn on the left side of the road.

Another five miles up the highway you will discover Ten Sleep Fish Hatchery (right side of the road). Turn right onto WY 435 and go about a mile. The address is 118 WY 435.



Ten Sleep Fish Hatchery

Your day trip begins by heading east toward Ten Sleep. The first stop is Ten Sleep Pioneer Museum, located at 436 2nd Street. Following your museum visit, it's time to head east, about four miles, to the Wigwam Rearing Station. Look for the turn on the left side of the road.

Another five miles up the highway you will discover Ten Sleep Fish Hatchery (right side of the road). Turn right onto WY 435 and go about a mile. The address is 118 WY 435.

Leaving the fish hatchery, turn right back out onto US 16, to head up scenic Ten Sleep Canyon. Stop at the Leigh Creek Monument information board (near milepost 36) and look up to find the monument that is located up on the rim of Ten Sleep Canyon. You will find Deer Lodge and Meadowlark Lodge on your way top of the pass if you are in need of refreshment. Coming back toward Ten Sleep, you will come to Wyoming 436. This is also Rome Hill Road. There is nothing to see here as far as Interpretive Signs; however, it is the road that leads to the Ten Sleep Preserve-Nature Conservancy. The management at the preserve request that you call ahead before visiting (307-366-2671). Heading to the last stop of the day, return to Ten Sleep and go south on Wyoming 434. It is located on the west edge of town (to the right it is Cottonwood Street, and to the left is WY 434). Drive about seven miles south on Wy 434 to the Interpretive Site. Return to US 16 and turn left to return to Worland.
